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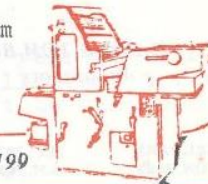
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" THOUGHTS "

How many times do we hear members complain, rightly so, about the poor state of the Clubrooms, inside and out. Well, all is not lost. The committee has now embarked upon a definite programme to bring the Clubrooms up to standard. The list of jobs to be done is long and the work varied. Our initial major projects are (1) to complete the Senior change room (2) to renovate the Junior change room. (3) to renovate the Kiosk (4) to decorate the outside of the Clubhouse.

There are numerous other little jobs that require urgent attention, all members will be asked at some stage to give a little help, it's a case of "many hands make light work". Some of the jobs require the help of tradesmen, others simply require "hands".

The U.15's are already supplying rubble to fill in the "mud hole" at the rear of the club, and to clear the gutters. A bricklayer has started on shower walls in the Senior change room and Jack Elsworth is about to start on a new store cupboard in the visitors change room.

The work to be done is very extensive, but not too demanding in terms of expert skill so rest assured you will be asked to give a couple of hours of your time to help. The Clubrooms belong to us all, so please remember, an hour of your time will help benefit us all- boys, senior players, parents, dart players, casual visitors- The Lot.
