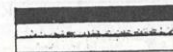
U 14Karingal Utd. 3 - Beaumaris 1

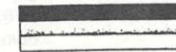
Going by this result we can win a few games yet but the boys will have to think about the game and stop the kick and rush stuff which has dominated most of our games.

A dissapointing factor that emerged was the loss of several U/18's to another Club, I believe we could have fielded a team had the pre season build up not been so busy and a likely Manager or Coach attempted to build a squad. Next year there will definately be a full team !!.

The Under 11's are still firing in the Cup, in fact they are out achieving even Manager Mike Oakleys dreams and are a credit to Liam O'Kellys coaching skills.

The most outstanding team (or teams) to me is still the U 7's, they are murdering the opposition and show an eagerness, even in defeat, that leaves most other squads in the shade.

The patience and understanding shown by Manager Alex Ormond and Coach Phil Moore is outstanding, a pattern which should be followed by all.

To not mention the previous two years of masochism by the U 16's would be remiss of me, as 14's and 15's they were thrashed, beaten and subdued by all and sundry, this year as young adults they have now reached second on the ladder, even getting into the last eight teams in the cup only to be beaten by a 'Sudden Death' penalty goal at Ascot Vale. My only regret this year is that as Junior Vice President I have not had the time to fulfill the full duties of Manager and give them the time they require to extend themselves fully.

Junior Presentation Day will be the 11th October and with Peninsula Shield Games, Cup Games and Team Photograph Day (24rd Sept) we are approaching a busy tail end to the 1987 season.

On a far more serious subject, the Clubs financial problem, I would like to offer some comments.

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Never in all my wildest dreams did I envisage that 1987 would become so intense or so ignoble regarding the Clubs financial status, what occured was bad enough, what ensued was worse.

Admittedly a member of the Committee did mismanage Club Funds, he also initiated some actions which led to a monetry deficit, I do not believe however that he set out to decieve anyone or to deliberately 'fiddle the books' What happened was allowed to happen, total blame should not be levelled at one person.

For the main component of the Clubs Management to adopt the 'Ostrich' approach is only aggravating the problem.

The 'Special General Meeting' was a debacle and achieved little it should have, minor arguments were raised, many of which bore no relation to the problem to be discussed, a crucial vote was taken in about five stages, arguments permitting no one clear picture to be formed by anyone present and each of the two precise voting points only being dealt with peripherally.

The Club has now reached the stage where a Solicitor has been consulted and some form of legal action will follow.

How can it ??

If a specific amount were mentioned that had been removed from the club till, prosecution could follow; what is the amount? a total of approximately \$10,000 which is representative of a profit margin which should exist but doesn't !!.

That word again : MISMANAGEMENT. Which means essentially that management did not do their job. Who prosecutes who?, who persecutes who?.

I was a party to this mismanagement, I allowed it to happen and intend helping put the Club back on an even Financial Keel.

Whilst I cannot condone the actions which led to this situation I feel that is has been debated and discussed long enough, lets get on with the job of making Karingal Soccer Club viable again.

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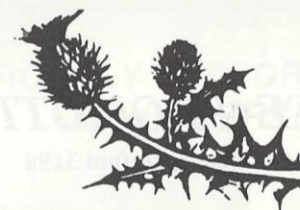
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
