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JUNIOR REPORT

We are now rapidly approaching the end of the season and I think it's fair to say that our Juniors have had a fairly successful season. The Under 12A's and Under 14's continue to dominate their Leagues and if they can maintain form on the run in, will bring some honour to the Club this year. All the other teams are just about winning as many games as they are losing so I can safely say we are all doing well. This only goes to show that the junior management and coaching side of our club is working and with continuity we can improve even further next year.

Unfortunately our Presentation Day cannot be held until Sunday 16 October because Regional Cup competitions are being held for most age groups on the previous weekends. This means that our U/7 to U/10 age groups will have to wait almost a month after their season finishes. However we can assure them that the wait will be worthwhile as we have been very fortunate to gain the services of Jeff Olver (the Soccerroo Goalkeeper) to present our trophies. He will have just returned from the Seoul Olympic Games and we must now keep our fingers crossed that nothing prevents him from visiting our Junior Red Devils.

An important change has been announced by the VSF for next year which will effect all players. The date which determines Age Group for Junior players has been changed from 1st January to 1st August, e.g. to play U/15 in 1989 a player must be U/15 on 1st August 1988. This conforms with the international FIFA date operating in all other countries with which Australia is now competing down to Under 13 level.

Finally, I am pleased to report that the unpleasant charges laid against our Under 10's by Cranbourne (for unduly rough play) were judged to be totally unfounded and were thrown out by the VSF Disciplinary Committee. However I'd like to remind all parents - please don't get involved in scenes with parents from opposing sides - leave the running of the game to the Referee (if there is one) and team officials.
