JUNIOR REPORT

We've now just passed the half way mark in the season and I'm more than pleased with the majority of results so far. Team spirit appears to be high in all teams and most importantly the boys are improving their skills and enjoying their soccer as the season goes on. I'd like to thank all the managers and coaches who have given so much of their time organizing behind the scenes to make each team successful.

It wasn't a very good start to the year when we were unable to recruit enough boys in the U11, U13 and U15 age groups which meant that for the first time we couldn't field teams in those grades. We aren't the only Club to experience shortages this year but I can only hope we will encourage some of those who gave the game away or went elsewhere to return. We can then fill those gaps in our team lists next year. One bright note on the horizon is our intention to field a team in the Under 18 Youth League next year. The Club is progressing well with a youth policy to bridge the gap between junior and senior ranks and an U18 team is an imperative part of this policy. Our two U16 teams this year form the ideal base for our proposed U18 squad. This, in my opinion, is the single most important issue to be aimed at by the juniors next year.

U7: Our permanent U7 Manager Alex Ormond was sorely missed by all while he was absent through ill health in the early part of the season. He is now back in action doing a wonderful job with the kids and with Coach Rick Condon assisting, their two teams have been really humming in the past couple of weeks.

U8: Manager Bob Paice and Coach Johnny Rowe have put together two good teams that are having an excellent season with many fine results.

U9: Special thanks are given to Manager Bruce Millard and Coach Tommy Weir for all their hard work with this team. They have struggled along for most of the season with only 8 boys. They have kept going with help from the U8 and U10 on match days. We have now managed to fill the vacancies and although the results have been quite good, watch for improvements in the second half.

U10: This squad are having a super season. To date they've only lost 3 games. Alan Jones and Norrie Davie have some exciting prospects here. Let's hope we can keep them together.

U12B: This team is largely an U11 squad who are playing a year above themselves. Dave Chidlow and Ron Shearn must be pleased with the way things have gone so far. They will be very competitive when they play in their own age group again.

U12A: These boys under the guidance of Mike Oakley and Liam O'Kelly have continued on from last years tremendous success. They're still undefeated in their League and have scored 30 goals for the loss of only 4. They're the only Karingal side that made it through to the last 16 in the Victorian Cup.

U14: This team are our other star on the horizon. So far, apart from their Cup defeat, they've only lost one match and that's a sore point with them. They are right up there at the top and I'm sure they'll be there at the end of the season. Jack Wardle and Steve Parratt will help them all the way.

These latter two teams (U12A and U14) are peppered with lads who have represented Karingal at both State and Regional level and hopefully will continue to do so.

U16B: Bill Thomas and Brian Moran have every reason to be pleased with the way this team is performing. They've now got a squad of 14 players and the results indicate they are on the way up.

U16A: This squad are our enigma! The results don't reflect the amount of talent in the team. In the hardest league of all they've been committing suicide when in front and have beaten themselves. If Norm Boag and Bill Smith can get them to concentrate for the full 80

minutes, they will improve their position dramatically.

Although we lost three teams this year, I still believe that we are in a strong position and that all our teams are a credit to the Club. If we can retain all our players, managers and coaches for next year - AND fill the gaps - we'll have a great year next year.

I'd like to pass on special thanks to Mary McGinty and her helpers for their untiring work in the kiosk on match days. They are still asking for help from ANYONE.

Finally I'd like to invite and encourage all Junior parents to become involved in the Club, socially or otherwise.
