FERENC PUSKAS



WELCOME TO KARINGAL

FERENC PUSKAS, one of the greatest and most successful Soccer Players in the world, is back in Melbourne for at least three years. He has been brought to Australia by the Australian-Hungarian Friendship Society to Coach boys aged nine years and over.

Now aged 62 he still looks as smart (apart from the bulging waistline) as when he captained Hungary in the famous Wembley massacre when the Mighty Magyars became the first team from outside the British Isles to beat England (November 1953). Puskas scored twice as England was thrashed 6-3. The following May Hungary repeated the win (in Hungary) 7-1 and Puskas scored twice again.

These were just two of the highlights in 84 matches for Hungary in which he scored 85 goals. Puskas then moved to Spain where he took out Spanish nationality and played 3 internationals with Spain and many club games with Real Madrid. In the years from 1960 to 1964 Puskas was the Spanish League top goalscorer.

The most famous game that Puskas took part in was the 1960 European Cup Final when Real Madrid beat Eintracht Frankfurt 7-3. Puskas scored 4 goals and did Stefano 3 in a game that will be talked about as long as soccer is played anywhere.

Ferenc Puskas will always be remembered for his world famous left foot which still hasn't lost its magic touch. Puskas never had a right foot - that was just for standing on ! However, with a left foot like that, who needs a right foot !

Mr Puskas began his Coaching on 25 September at a new Soccer Complex in Springvale Rd. Keysborough (next to Haileybury College). For all enquiries, please phone 584 6905.
