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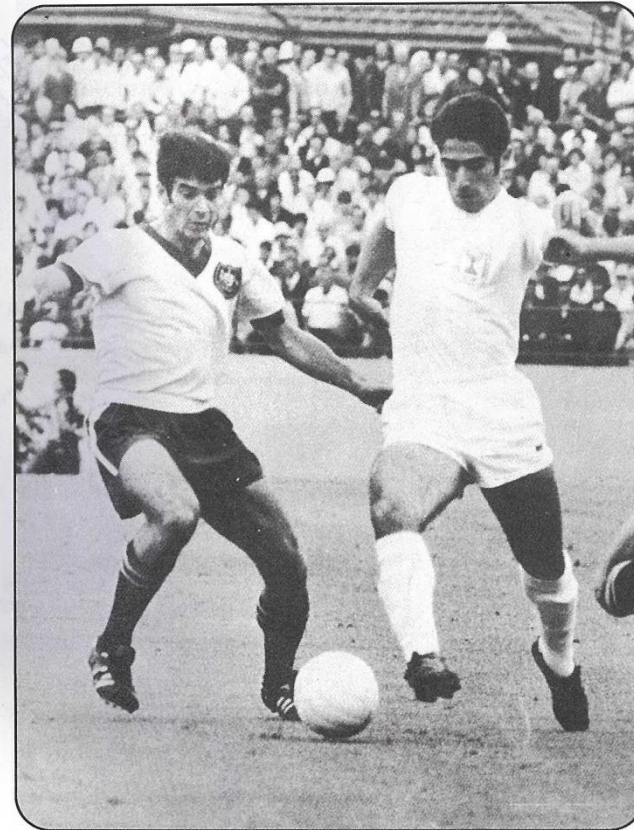

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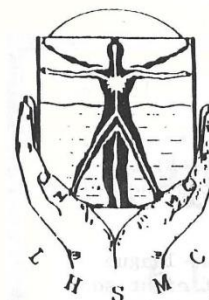

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THE 10 POINTS OF SUCCESS TO KARINGAL UNITED'S FUTURE.

For this club to have a long-term future with at least moderate success, we must aim to meet the following criteria:

1. Sound administration at senior level, with realistic targets, budgets.
2. A quality senior coaching staff who know what they are on about, high profile personality if possible, and only if within the budget.
3. Junior administration personnel with an open communication channel to the seniors admin. must be included in the planning of this clubs future, and made aware of the clubs policies and hopes.
4. Junior teams ranging from under 10 through to 18 with at least seven teams competing on a regular basis.
5. Quality Junior Coaches, who are interested to teach players the basic skills without the burden of winning trophies. Don't forget our aim is to find talent for our future, not short term trophies.
6. Three good grounds to play football on, with a strong case prepared to fence in Ballam Park and force a commitment from the council. If the answer is negative, the club must then make a choice, if they should pursue new facilities so they have a chance to move up the leagues, or stay where they are and become a development club.
7. It's important to have very good lights for training, to enhance the coach's ability to put on proper sessions, which will in turn improve the quality of the football played by the club.
8. Another very important factor of a good football club is to have the right facilities. You need good balls, training bibs, cones, clean dressing rooms, hot showers are so necessary for the harmony of the team.

9. To keep all the above going you also need a good Social Club within the actual Football Club. They should have an independent committee and keep the whole atmosphere going with regular events.
10. Now the most important ingredient of all, without it you totally waste your time SUPPORTERS are the cornerstone of every Club. Don't fool yourself without them the club will not survive, with them anything is possible, so my message is go out and get as many as possible, there are never enough Supporters.

Now if you work and believe in yourselves this Soccer Club has a good chance to go on. How far who knows? But you have to be realistic. You are just one with the same hopes as another hundred. Even though the Administration ability of this club is a long way in front of many others.

But if you want it bad enough you can get good enough, Dick Jones and his team have started to rebuild the foundations already.

I am trying also to hopefully start a new dynasty for young players to establish a standard for the Clubs future survival. To do this we must have our established players perform on a consistent level, and find the right experienced players to help mature and guide our younger ones.

Whichever way you look at it, 1991 has already been successful.

I don't usually single individual players out during the season, but I want to compliment them for their effort and support it's appreciated. I don't know where I'll be next year, but I have enjoyed this year, regardless of what happens in the next few weeks.

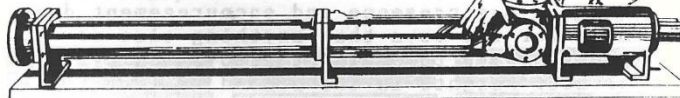
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UNDER - 9

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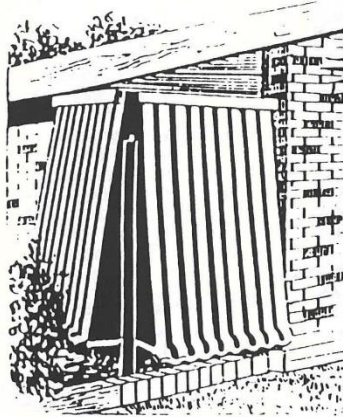
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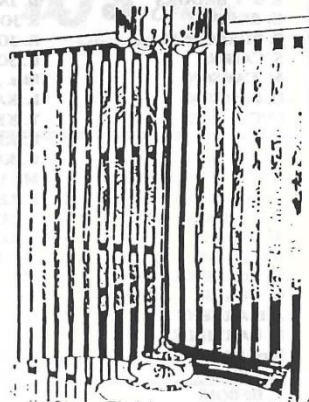
