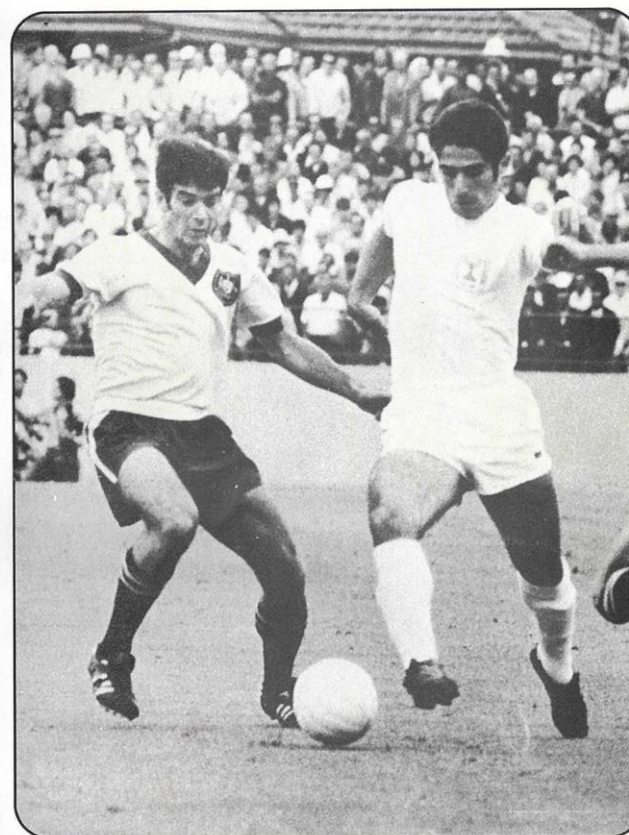

Hi, already another season has started, my third at Karingal United and probably my last. I've enjoyed my previous seasons here and have formed new bonds and friendships with a lot of nice people.

I have also appreciated the support given to me (and the players) by the Board, which has been a 100% without question.

The only reason I would want to leave is to Coach at a much higher level, I was ambitious as a player and made it, I still have this ambition.

Well since we improved four places on the ladder from 1990 to 1991, all we need to do is to repeat this performance. Kicked off with two valuable points away from home, and even more important was they were the only other team left that finished higher than us. We must now build on that, and get as many points as possible before teams settle.

Please give us your full support, the boys appreciate it and need it.

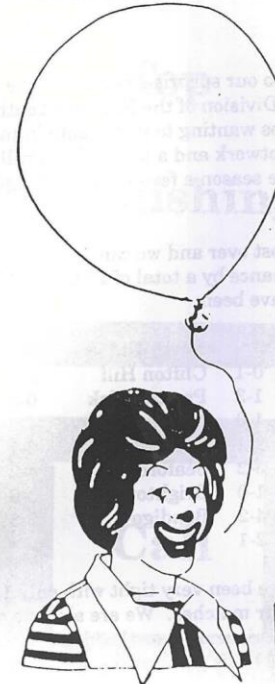

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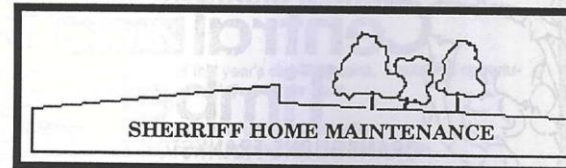
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Vice President Seniors

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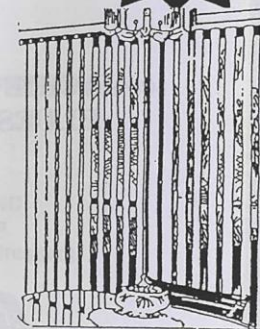
