PHASED INTRODUCTION OF RULE CHANGES INTO LOCAL SOCCER

While the new laws enacted by the International Football Association Board officially come into effect on July 25, Australia has gained approval for a phased introduction of the changed regulations.

They will be introduced into the nation's senior competition when the Coca-Cola Soccer League commences its season later this year.

For the rest of Australian soccer January 1, 1993, is the day when everyone will have to fall in line.

According to the latest edition of FIFA News, the most important effect of the deliberations of the International Board's 106th Annual Meeting at Newport, Wales, is that from now on the world's soccer players have fewer timewasting tactics available to them in their armoury of gamesmanship.

Members of the Board believe that changes to Law XII (Fouls and Misconduct) will help eliminate a common avenue of timewasting by declaring that, "on any occasion when a player deliberately kicks the ball to his own goalkeeper, the goalkeeper is not permitted to touch it with his hands. If, however, the goalkeeper does touch the ball with his hands, he shall be penalised by the award of an indirect free kick to be taken by the opposing team from the place where the infringement occurred, subject to the overriding conditions of Law XIII".

To assist in the implementation of the new rule, the Board added the following explanations:

1. The word "kicks" refers only to circumstances where a player plays the ball with the foot or feet.
2. Similarly, a deflection with the foot or feet is permitted in circumstances where it is not intentional (involuntary deflection or miskick from a team mate).
3. In situations where the ball is deliberately kicked by a team mate away from the goalkeeper (e.g., to the side of the goal), but with the intention that the goalkeeper may collect it, the spirit of the Law is that this would be regarded as an intentional pass to the goalkeeper. Therefore, if, in such situations, the goalkeeper touches the ball with his hands, an indirect free kick must be awarded.

Firm clampdown

FIFA describes this change, as well as further measures concerning Laws XIII (Free kick) and XVI (Goal kick) as aiming to speed up the conduct of the game, by allowing referees to clamp down firmly on timewasting tactics.

In future, upon infringement of the law on players' equipment (Law IV), players at fault will be instructed to leave the field while they adjust their equipment or obtain any missing equipment "when the ball next ceases to be in play".

In future play shall not be stopped immediately for an infringement of this law and players will not be able to return to the field of play without first reporting to the referee, at a moment "when the ball has ceased to be in play".

Under Law V (Referees) the red and yellow cards, which have become such an integral part of the game also gain their first mention in the rules, making their use mandatory at all levels of the sport.

It is hoped that timewasting will further be reduced by changes to Law XIII (Free kick).

Under the new rules any free kick awarded to the defending team within its own goal area may be taken from any point within the goal area.

As for indirect free kicks awarded to the attacking team within the opponent's goal area, they shall be taken from the part of the goal area line which runs parallel to the goal line, at the point nearest to where the offence was committed.

Goal kicks (Law XVI) in future can be taken from any point within the goal area of the defending team, hopefully eliminating one of the most common timewasting tactics in soccer.

Strict instructions to referees

In addition to the rule changes summarised above, the International Board also insisted that referees be "much stricter when dealing with timewasting tactics". Players who carry or kick the ball away after having a free kick awarded against their team, must be shown the yellow card, with the same punishment mandated in cases of encroachment from defensive walls.

Similar punishment is prescribed for players who stand in front of the ball when a free kick is awarded, thus allowing their team to gain time and organise a defensive wall.

The Board was outspoken in its condemnation of a tendency by referees to avoid correct applications of Law XII, which regulates control of the ball by goalkeepers.

Leniency in such situations "can no longer be accepted".

Referees were also instructed to strictly enforce those parts of Law XII, which relate to the number of steps taken by goalkeepers when they have control of the ball in their hands.

Finally, the length and color of bicycle shorts worn by footballers is to be strictly regulated in future.
