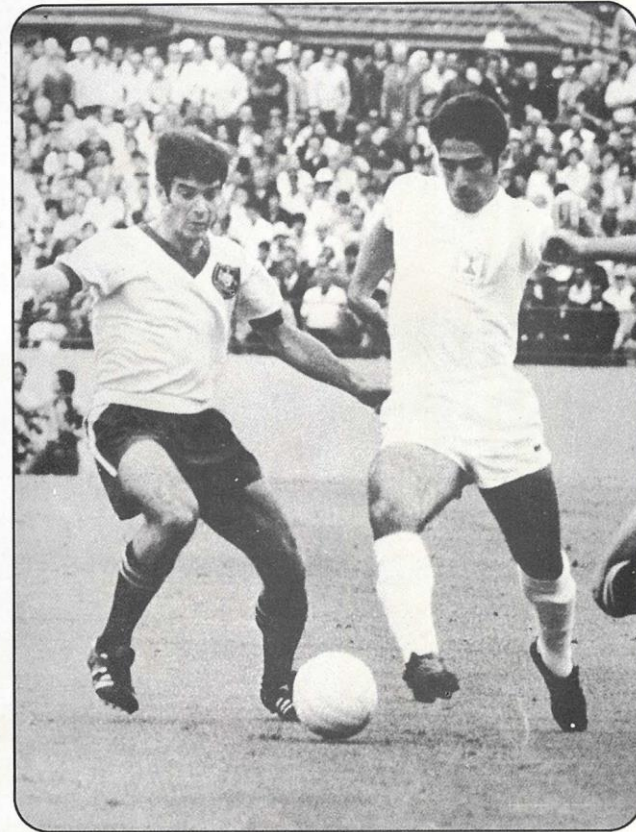

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1st Team Manager's Report

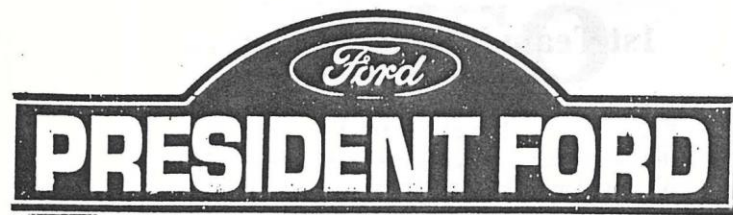

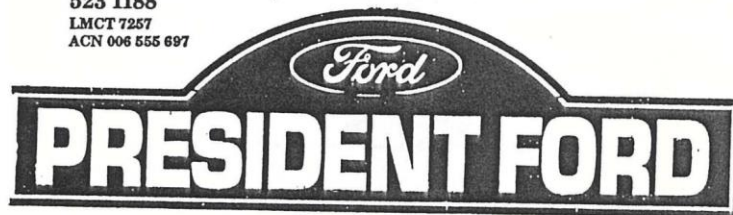

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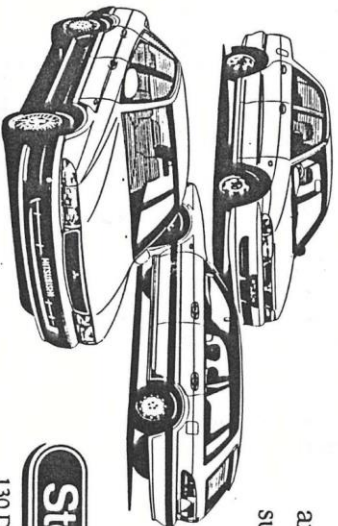


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JUNIOR REPORTS

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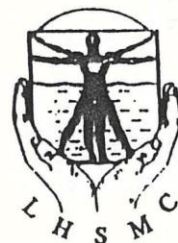

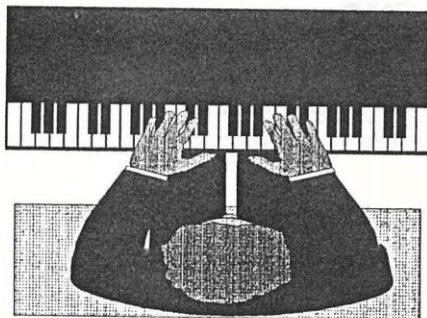

To try and explain what has happened to junior soccer in victoria please read on.

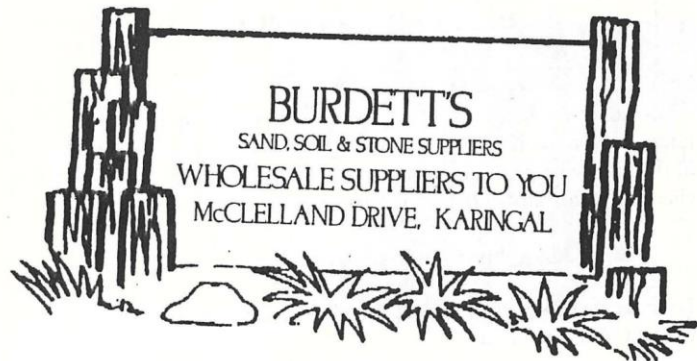
At the start of the season we entered an under 11, 12, 13, 15 and 16's teams which we believed would be very competitive ,with the boys we have .

Thank you also to the parents for their continued support, through their encouragement during weekly games and training.

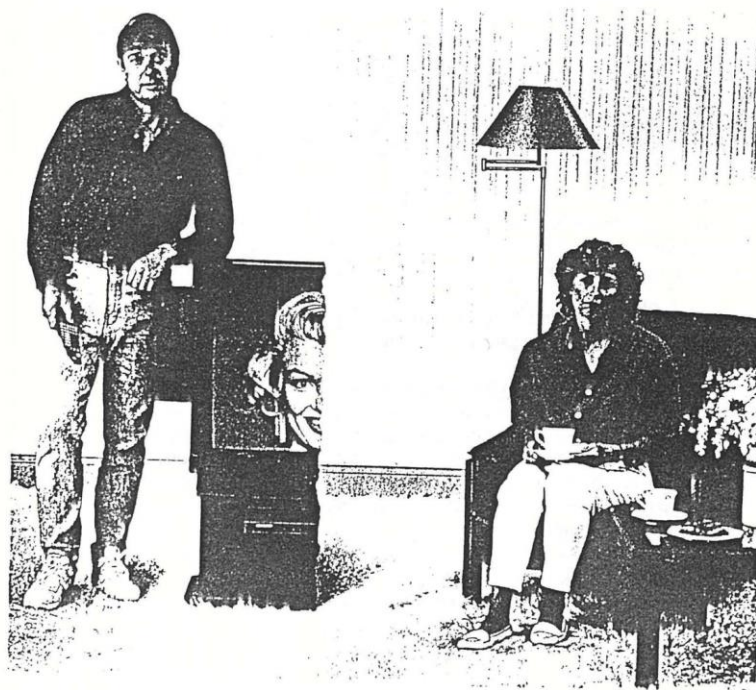

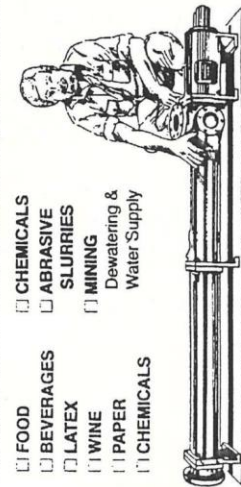
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"Reserve" Coach's Report
