Message from the Committee

With the season well and truly underway have you ever given thought to how the Club functions? It is easy to forget how the Club gets off to a start each year. It is due to a lot of behind the scenes hard work by the Club's committee. Your committee is made up of a small dedicated group of volunteers some of which have given ten years service to the club and some who continue to be involved long after their children have stopped playing for the Club. To think it was only 6 years ago that the Club, which was established in the 1960's, was on the brink of collapse. There were only 6 teams with 65 players, no money in the bank. Poor equipment, no fundraising, no canteen open during the season, no senior teams and only one usable small pitch and one under 7 pitch both of which were in a substandard condition.

How different it is to today where we now have over 230 players in 18 teams including 2 successful senior teams, a new full size pitch, a second full size pitch, an U7 pitch, 2 fully equipped clubrooms, 2 operating canteens, new equipment and tops, a healthy bank balance, a website and plans for a redevelopment of the main pavilion. It is a great achievement yet it can easily go back to the situation of 2000 if there is a lack of support by you, the players and parents, for the club. This support extends to having a strong committee providing not only administration services but also organising successful fundraising and social activities.

This year we still have a number of committee positions that still remain unfilled from last year and a number of current committee members have indicated their desire to move on at the end of the season. We strongly urge all parents, particularly those in the sub junior teams to give consideration to becoming a committee member. We recognise that most of us lead busy lives however if we have a fully staffed committee then the workload will be evenly spread. The term "many hands make light work" could not be more applicable. Most of the policy, procedures and infrastructure are already in place and the existing committee members will ensure that a smooth transition takes place.

Please do not leave it up to someone else. We all have to contribute something. This is a successful Club with a great future and we are sure that you all want it to see it continue. Our message is quite clear, no committee no club.
